

The children will learn to:

- ✓ recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils

 millions of years ago § recognise that living things produce offspring
 of the same kind, but normally offspring vary and are not identical to
 their parents
- ✓ identify how animals and plants are adapted to suit their environment in different ways and that adaptation may lead to evolution.
- identify and name the main parts of the human circulatory system, and describe the functions of the heart, blood vessels and blood
- ✓ recognise the impact of diet, exercise, drugs and lifestyle on the way their bodies function
- describe the ways in which nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.
