#### YOUNG CARERS ACTION DAY QUIZ

- 1. How many young carers are there in the UK?
- 2. On average, how many young carers are there in each classroom?
- 3. Up to 80% of young carers are missing out on things that other children their age are doing. True or False?
- 4. Young carers do better than their peers at GCSE level? True or False?
- 5. Most teachers know who the young carers are in their class. True or False?
- 6. What is the average age of a young carer?
- 7. Young carers are entitled to a carer's assessment. True or False?
- 8. What percentage of young carers are bullied simply because they are helping or caring for someone?
- 9. Most young carers don't want to go to college or university. True or False?
- 10. There are young carers as young as five years old. True or False?

#### ANSWERS

- 1. A survey in 2010 by the BBC estimated there to be 700,000 young carers in the UK. More recently figures indicate that this could now have reached 800,00 according to the Children's Society
- 2. There are an estimated two young carers in every classroom.
- 3. True. A Carers Trust survey found that 80% of young carers were missing out on their childhood because of their caring role.
- False. Young carers don't do as well at GCSE level as their peers (juggling caring and education can be tough!).
- 5. False. A survey found that 42% of young carers said there was not a particular person at school who recognised them as a carer and helped them.
- 6. The average age of a young carer is 13.6 years
- 7. True. Under the Care Act 2014, young carers are entitled to an assessment. In Doncaster this is done using the Outcome Star It will look at what can be done to make caring easier for a young carer.
- 8. In recent research, a quarter (26%) were bullied at school because they are helping or caring for someone.
- 9. False. The majority (84%) in a recent survey, said they intended to go to university or college.
- 10. True. Some services are working with younger or infant carers aged 5–8.9

#### **DID YOU KNOW?**

#### In Doncaster we have a free online mental wellbeing support service provided by an agency called Kooth.

Kooth offers emotional and mental health support for children and young people aged between 11 and 24.

On Kooth, qualified counsellors are online seven days a week to provide young people using the service with online counselling, through chat-based messaging via drop-in or booked sessions.

Kooth lets young people provide each other with peer to peer support through moderated online discussion boards and the ability to contribute to self-help articles and content.

Students will need to sign up to use Kooth, but it is completely free. You can sign yourself up today via their website **Kooth.com**
