A WARM WELCOME BACK TO SUMMER 2!

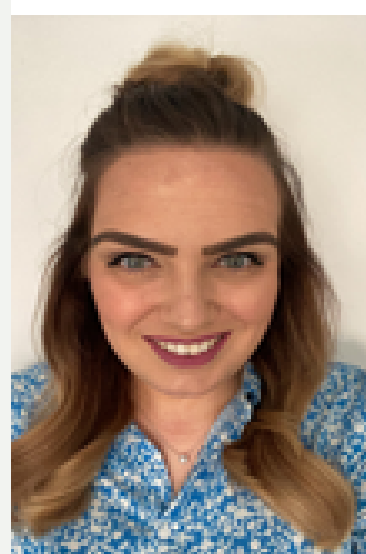

It has been lovely to welcome our pupils back to the academy, refreshed and ready for the start of our final half term. This is always an exciting time of year, with many special events and activities taking place across the academy.

This half term also marks the completion of a number of important assessments, including the Phonics Screening Check for Year 1 and some Year 2 pupils, the Multiplication Tables Check for Year 4, and end-of-year assessments for all year groups. Our pupils have worked incredibly hard throughout the year, and we are extremely proud of all they have achieved. School reports will be shared with parents at the end of the half term, alongside an optional Parents' Evening, providing an opportunity to discuss your child's progress and achievements in school.

For pupils with a SEND Support Plan, teachers will be reviewing current targets and setting new ones in preparation for the next academic year. These targets will then be shared with their new class teachers to ensure a smooth transition. SEND Support Plan meetings will take place after school on Wednesday 24th June, and parents and carers will be able to book a convenient appointment time. In addition, during our optional Parents' Evening on Wednesday 15th June, parents and carers—particularly those with children on our SEND register—will have the opportunity to meet their child's new teacher and ask any questions they may have.

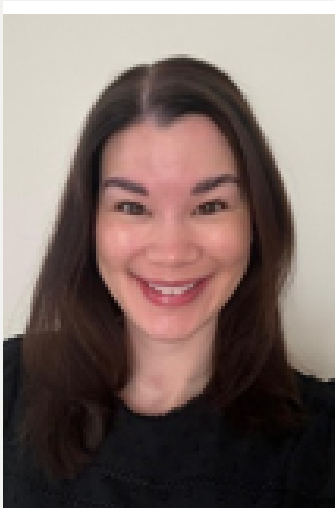
Executive Principal Update

OUR ATTENDANCE FOCUS

Days lost - what this means...

As we move into the final half term of the academic year, we would like to remind families of the important role that regular attendance plays in a child's education. Every day in school provides valuable learning opportunities, and even a small amount of absence can have a significant impact on progress and achievement.

To put this into perspective:

- **95% attendance = approximately 10 days of learning missed across the school year.**
- **90% attendance = approximately 20 days of learning missed – 4 weeks of school.**
- **85% attendance = approximately 30 days of learning missed – almost 6 weeks of education.**
- **80% attendance = approximately 40 days of learning missed – almost 8 weeks of school.**

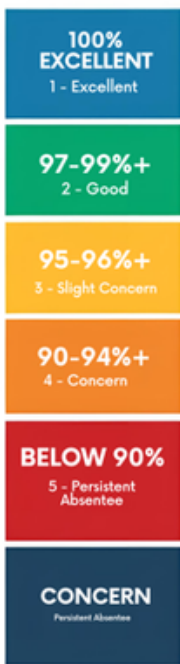
Research consistently shows a strong link between attendance and academic success. Pupils who attend school regularly are more likely to make good progress, achieve higher outcomes, build positive friendships, and develop confidence and resilience.

We understand that children will occasionally be absent due to illness, but we ask families to support us by ensuring children attend school every day and arrive on time. Together, we can help every child make the most of the learning opportunities available to them.

EVA's World Cup Attendance Challenge!

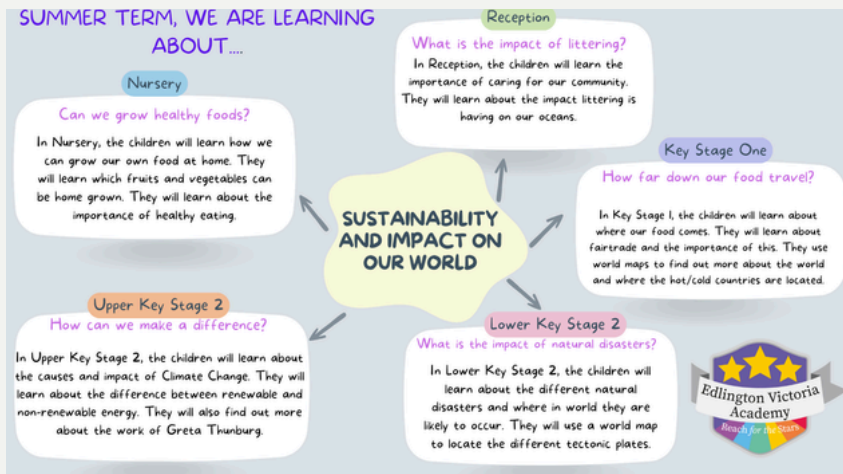
The Goal

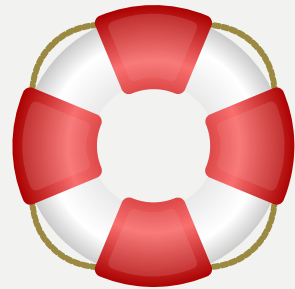


Water Safety Reminder:

Before May Half Term, Miss Bingham spoke to all our pupils in KS2 about the importance of water safety. As the warmer weather continues, we would like to remind all families about the importance of staying safe around open water. Sadly, over the half-term break, there were a number of tragic incidents across the UK involving young people entering rivers, lakes, reservoirs, and other open water areas.

Whilst open water can appear inviting on hot days, it can be extremely dangerous. Cold water shock, hidden currents, steep banks, and underwater hazards can put even strong swimmers at risk.

We encourage parents and carers to speak with their children about the dangers of swimming in open water and the importance of only swimming in supervised, designated areas. If children find themselves in difficulty in the water, they should remember the advice to **Float to Live**: tilt your head back, keep your ears submerged, relax, and use your hands to help you stay afloat until you can control your breathing and call for help.
